Horse Barn Registration for Clinton County Fair

General Information - Stalls will be available for Exhibitors on a first come basis (by postmark date) after July 1. All completed registration forms, a copy of official E IA negative test results within 12-months, a Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship Form (VCPR), a copy of the rabies vaccination certificate, a self-addressed stamped envelope and \$25 deposit per horse are to be received by mail for registration to be complete. Checks are to be made payable to Clinton County Fair Association. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) dated after May 1, 2011 must be presented at check in, but will not be kept by the chairperson.

NOTE: *Sawdust for bedding may not be available. Other arrangements may have to be made.*

Horses stalled during Fair Week are required to be on display from Saturday, August 6, 8 AM, through Saturday, August 13, 10:00 PM. Not meeting these time frames will forfeit any premiums awarded during this year's Fair and the loss of the privilege of stalling at future Clinton County Fairs. RULES

1. . Sign up two Classes in advance. No refunds unless Class is cancelled. A signed blank check is required from exhibitors to run a tab for entry fees.
2. Each exhibitor will need a Fair Registration number. The same number is used for all events during the Fair. Complete mailing address required. Each rider/horse combination will need its own Fair Registration number.
3. Premiums: \$10 \$8 \$6 \$4 \$3. \$2.
Premiums will be mailed.
Ribbons through sixth place.
4. Pre-registration \$4 per Class. No refunds. If Classes are added the day of the Show, they will be added at \$5 per Class. Send Pre-registration with payment prior to August 1st, to Arleen Parker, P.O. Box 257, Blanchard, PA 16826, or bring to Horse Barn Office August 6th between 6:00 and 8:00 pm. Make checks payable to **Clinton County Fair Association**. Pre-registered entrants must check

in at the Registration Booth prior to the start of the Show to pick up back number, confirm classes and present required health and/or registration papers.

5. Pee Wee riders may only show in Classes 6, 9, 12, 13, 18, 38, 41 and 44- trot only, penalty for canter.
6. Show Committee will have final decision and reserves the right to combine, divide and cancel Classes.
7. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated and Show Committee reserves the right to withhold premiums.
8. Protective headgear is required for exhibitors 18 years and younger.
9. Horse trailer parking in designated areas only.

4. Pre-registration before August 1, 2011. No refunds. Pre-registration may be mailed, along with payment, to Biff Walizer, 28 Walscher Lane, Mill Hall, PA 17751. Pre-registered entrants must check in at the Registration Booth prior to the start of the Show to pick up number, confirm Classes and present required health papers.
5. Long sleeve shirt, long pants and hard sole boots with heels required.

7. An exhibitor may enter each Class only once.

Champion and Reserve Class - the first place teams from the 4-H and Open Classes will compete in a showmanship championship.

ENTRY FEE: \$3 Per Team

PREMIUMS: (Per Team) \$36 \$24 \$18.

RULES:

1. Pre-registration required by August 10, 2011
2. Each exhibitor will need a Fair Registration number. The same number is used for all events during the Fair. Complete mailing address required.
3. Premiums will be mailed.
Ribbons through sixth place.
Rosettes only for champion and reserve.
4. Each team will consist of 3 grooms and 1 horse. Each team will provide horse and identify at time of registration. This horse must be available for preparation by Show Committee by noon on August 11.
5. Each team will provide their own grooming tools and supplies. All supplies must be brought into the ring by team members only at the beginning of the competition and remain in their designated area.
6. Teams will have 20 minutes to prepare their horse for a Grooming and Showmanship Class.
7. One team member will be the showman and will present the horse to be judged. The Showman must be properly attired for this portion of the contest.
8. All other team members remain with their equipment in their designated area.
9. The judge will be observing the teams as they groom their horses, watching for safety, proper use of tools and supplies and team cooperation. This along with their grooming and showmanship score will determine the winner.
10. Horse trailer parking in designated areas only.

RULES:

1. All decorated stalls in the horse barn will be judged on Tuesday, August 9.
2. Each exhibitor will need a Fair Registration number. The same number is used for all events during the Fair. Complete mailing address required.
3. Ribbons awarded in each category in each division. Premiums will be mailed.
4. Exhibitor's information card must be displayed clearly on stall door.
5. Stalls may be decorated in any style and with any materials. Use of electrical displays, screws or nails and painting is not permitted. All materials used including staples, tacks, wire and string must be removed. The inside aisle may not be blocked by any material.

Good Housekeeping Procedures

1. These rules will be for all 4-H, Open Dairy and Open Horse
2. Livestock and Horse Exhibitors will be put into groupings by their species by chair when stalls are assigned.
3. Groupings will include between 3 and 6 exhibits for all large animals and should have no more than 15 for poultry or rabbits.
4. Those groupings will be posted at the 4-H Food Booth.
5. Good Housekeeping will be judged three (3) times throughout the week for each species. (This will not be announced, but will be at random.)
6. During each judging, one group will be chosen from each species as the winners.
7. The winning groups will be posted at the 4-H Food Booth and each member of those groups will receive a coupon for a free hot dog or drink at the 4-H Food Stand.
